## **New equipment to help south western Sydney women**

Patients at Liverpool Hospital will benefit from a \$24,000 donation from the Rotary Club of Liverpool Greenway, which has been used to purchase equipment for the Hospital's Gynaecological Oncology Unit.

Two colposcopes were purchased, which are used to help diagnose and treat cervical cancer.

As well as the Rotary donation, a further \$8,000 was provided from gynaecological oncology patient donations to purchase the additional electronic equipment required to operate the scopes.

Liverpool Hospital Director of Gynaecological Oncology Dr Felix Chan said the additional electronic equipment would help improve the storage of medical images, which is beneficial for teaching and long term patient care.

"The new scopes have a range of special features that will help hospital staff to diagnose and treat patients with cervical dysplasia and cancer," said Dr Chan.

Hospital General Manager, Anthony Schembri said the Hospital was thankful to Rotary for their extraordinary fundraising efforts.

"This new equipment is a great asset to patients and staff and we are very thankful to Rotary Liverpool Greenway for their ongoing efforts to support the Hospital," Mr Schembri said.
